Customer Instructions for Rebates Energy Efficiency **Income-Qualified** Program

Rebates Effective October 1, 2025 ~ While Funding is Available

The Richland Energy Services Income-Qualified Energy Efficiency Program includes conservation rebates for electrically heated, owner-occupied homes in the City of Richland service area. For more information about participation in this program, please contact Richland Energy Services (RES) at (509) 942-7431.

Customer Instructions: After the **Income-Qualified Application** is approved, follow these steps:

1. Complete the Income-Qualified Application and have it reviewed and approved by Community Action Connections in Pasco
2. **OPTIONAL:** A low-interest loan is available through RES for qualifying HVAC and weatherization upgrades. Request an application from RES staff after the Income-Qualified Application is approved. Any applicable rebates will be applied as a down payment to the loan.
3. Contact one or more HVAC and weatherization contractors from the Authorized Contractor List. Let them know that you want to participate in RES's Income-Qualified Energy Efficiency Program. The contractor submits an itemized project bid/proposal to RES. To qualify for a rebate, a RES Authorized Contractor must perform all work. RES does not fund "Do-It-Yourself" projects.
4. After selecting a contractor, notify RES staff for review and approval of the proposal/work. A "Notice to Proceed" will be sent to your contractor once all documents are received and loan documents signed, if applicable.
5. Your contractor will coordinate with you to schedule the work and an inspection by a City Building Department inspector which is required for all measures except insulation.
6. The contractor will credit applicable rebates to you as a separate line item on your invoice. (RES will reimburse the contractor for the rebates credited to you).

Insulated Exterior Door: Single-Family, Multi-Family and MH	Homes must have electric heat. Replace un-insulated or otherwise substandard exterior doors. The replacement door must be a pre-hung ENERGY STAR® qualified door and include replacement of the threshold.		\$700
