### **Energy Conservation**

Cooling and heating your home uses more energy than any other system in your home. Follow these simple and practical tips to conserve energy, save on your utility bill, and stay cool during the warmer weather:

- Set your thermostat at the highest setting while remaining comfortable. The Department of Energy recommends 78 degrees.
- Avoid using your oven, dryer, or dishwasher during the hottest parts of the day.
- Use ceiling and oscillating fans when possible. Run ceiling fans counterclockwise.
- Close blinds and window coverings during the hottest times of the day.
- · Grill outdoors or use your microwave oven to prepare meals.
- Turn off lights, television and appliances when not in use.
- · Check your cooling system filter and replace if dirty.
- Have a plan in place in case power goes out and you need a cool place to stay.
- Check on your extended family and neighbors to ensure everyone's safety. City of Richland facilities, including the Richland Public Library, City Hall and Community Center are open to the public if needed for cooling options. Visit www.ci.richland.wa.us for hours of operation.

#### **Water Conservation**

When it comes to conserving water, small adjustments can have a noticeable impact. Follow these simple tips and you may see a decrease in your water bill this summer.

- Watering Times: Watering your yard in the early morning or evening ensures more of the water you expend soaks into your lawn or garden.
- Fix Drips: Leaking spigots can add a substantial amount of water loss if left unrepaired. Check washers and connections frequently, and repair any hoses, as needed.
- Check for Leaks in Your Toilet Tank: A common cause of wasted water is a leak in the tank of a toilet. Check if your tank has a leak causing water waste. Simply put a couple of drops of food coloring in the tank. If the color makes its way to the toilet bowl, your tank is leaking.
