NEW SAVESTATION LOCATION

Richland Fire and Emergency Services is dedicated to improving neurologically intact survival from sudden cardiac arrest with its Heart Safe Richland initiative. To date, six Automated External Defibrillator (AED) SaveStations have been strategically placed in Richland to provide the public with 24/7 access to lifesaving equipment in the event of a nearby cardiac arrest. The most recent SaveStation was installed at Columbia Playfields near the concessions at 1500 Mansfield Street. For more information, visit www.ci.richland.wa.us/savestation.
